## ACADEMIC SUPPORT

### Learning Assistance Center (LAC)

The Learning Assistance Center supports the academic mission of UNCG for all undergraduate students. LAC is an academic support program that challenges students to become independent and successful learners. They offer tutoring, academic skills sessions, a resource lab for studying, and Outreach Workshops on Learning Skills (OWLS).

### Special Support Services (SSS)

Special Support Services is a TRIO education support program designed to maximize academic performance for UNCG students who are first-generation college students, are from a low to modest income background, or are registered with Disability Services. SSS implements its belief that all students can be successful given the proper assistance, and to define, recognize, and respect each student's individual abilities.

### Student Academic Services (SAS)

Student Academic Services provides academic advising, first-year initiatives and programs to aid undergraduate success. Major functions of SAS include the following: academic advising, faculty advisor training and support, coordination of the University Studies program, coordination of the Strategies for Academic Success Program, coordination of the Peer Academic Leaders program, advising at-risk students, reviewing appeals for exceptions to university degree requirements and academic policies, programming for undergraduate academic success, and research and evaluation of undergraduate success initiatives.

### Supplemental Instruction Program (SIP)

Supplemental Instruction Program is a series of weekly discussion/review sessions for students taking historically difficult courses. SIP is available to all students enrolled in specific course sections. These sessions consist of a discussion facilitated by a SIP leader. The SIP leader knows the course content and sits through each class meeting. The leader hears what the class hears, and reads what the class reads in order to assist students in thinking critically about the course material.



## HEALTH & WELLNESS



### Student Health Services (SHS)

Student Health Services includes the Wellness Center, the Medical Clinic, the Counseling and Testing Center, and the Pharmacy. The SHS Medical Clinic provides primary care services for UNCG students. Services include allergy injections, family planning, health education, immunizations, lab and x-ray services, primary medical care, and peer education. For sudden illness and injuries, you will be seen based on your situation after being evaluated by the nursing staff.

### The Wellness Center

The Wellness Center provides educational programs, classes and seminars on alcohol, tobacco, smoking cessation, sexual assault and harassment, nutrition and eating disorders, stress management, addiction, diversity, general wellness, grief, and many other areas.

### The Counseling and Testing Center (CTC)

The Counseling and Testing Center is a primary mental health agency for students at UNCG. The CTC is a professional staff of licensed psychologists, licensed social workers, and graduate interns. They provide free individual, group, and couples counseling to currently enrolled students. The CTC also provides consultation, psycho-educational programs and training.

### University Police

The UNCG Police Department is a fully commissioned, professional force of 31 police officers and 10 uniformed security officers. As sworn law enforcement officers, members of the UNCG Police Department are authorized to carry firearms, and under NC law, have the power to make arrests, and conduct investigations for crimes that occur on property owned by the University. Uniformed Officers patrol the campus 24 hours a day. You may file an anonymous report with the Police, register for Rape Aggression Defense classes, and participate in the Victim Assistance Program, along with many other programs. The UNCG Police assists other local authorities including emergency medical response teams with on-campus incidents.

## ADVOCACY



### Dean of Students Office

The mission of the Dean of Students Office is to contribute to the educational mission of the University by initiating programs and services that support an environment conducive to academic and personal development. The staff is committed to advocating for students, challenging students to accept responsibility for their choices, education and consulting faculty, staff, and students, coordinating processes that uphold community values, proactively addressing and responding to crisis, and providing opportunities for students to develop critical thinking skills.

### Office for Adult Students (OAS)

The mission for the Office of Adult Students is to facilitate programs and services enhancing the University experience and the retention of adult students. The Office advocates on behalf of adult students.

### Office of Disability Services (ODS)

The Office of Disability Services offers eligible students a wide range of services upon request, including: alternative testing, adaptive technology/computer services, testing accommodations, interpreter services, and advocacy.

### Office of Multicultural Affairs (OMA)

The Office of Multicultural Affairs promotes the appreciation of cultural diversity and fosters intercultural and cross-cultural understanding. OMA provides programs and services that support the academic mission of UNCG by enhancing the educational, personal, cultural, and social development of students. OMA strives to build positive advocacy and collaborative relationships with the general student body with a special emphasis on under-represented student populations.
